

## 2018 Year End Review

## Meeting Immediate Needs

1,300 children participated in Springboard To Learning programs, including afterschool programs for children from Kindergarten through 8th grade in all multifamily communities.

**300** adults participated in Springboard To Success programs including **103** new Career Success participants. **76%** of program graduates have gone back to school or found a job after graduation.

3000 participants attended
Springboard To Community programs
that build community and meet
urgent needs, including serving over
10,000 meals to families and children
experiencing food insecurity.



## Propelling Long-Term Success

In 2018, Springboard provided over 150

new children with Children's Savings

Accounts to ensure Springboard kids have
access to funds for post-secondary
education and served as an advisor for the

Better Together Commission advocating for
family voice in Jackson Public Schools.

Springboard joined the Jackson BankOn
Steering Committee to advocate for inclusive, local banking opportunities, and nationally joined the Aspen Family Prosperity
Innovation Community, working with policy partners and national advisors to advocate for family centered policies in the workplace.

In October, Springboard launched **The Magnolia Mother's Trust**, a guaranteed income pilot offering 16 Springboard mothers \$1000 per month for a year to demonstrate the importance of unrestricted cash to support low-income families in reaching their goals.





Springboard To Opportunities is built on the belief that affordable housing on its own is not enough to create thriving communities where all can succeed, and while meeting residents' basic needs, such as food insecurity and housing stability, is an essential part of the work, if we truly want families to break cycles of generational poverty, we have to do more. That is why we always pair programs that meet residents' immediate needs with larger economic justice programs that seek to propel residents towards their larger goals and push for structural and policy change to support low-income families.
